The Palimpsest

"An inherited mathematical equation makes Gordon Marlow the world's most hunted man."

In a near-future world ruled by *The Machine*—a ruthless United Nations surveillance state—every citizen's life is coded, catalogued, and erased if they defy compliance.

Feon Jax (28), a weary barrio chef, lives in obscurity until a hidden notebook reveals his true identity: *Gordon Marlow*, son of the infamous mathematician *Severin Marlow*, whose forbidden research sought to unlock the "God equation"—a unifying theory with power to reshape existence itself. Severin was executed, Gordon's mother institutionalized, and his twin sister Blythe vanished. But Severin left behind *The Palimpsest*, an ancient manuscript and cipher that could either liberate humanity—or enslave it under The Machine.

When Gordon is targeted by Secretary-General **Audrey Ajay**, a merciless architect of genocidal "mercy operations," he is forced into flight. Rescued by the enigmatic **Dr. Hun**, a scarred scientist rebel, Gordon learns his survival and knowledge make him the last obstacle between Ajay and absolute dominion. Alongside **Charlie Bellows**, the sharp daughter of a fallen archivist, and **Fritz Schrödinger**, an aged physicist, Gordon begins assembling a clandestine alliance of hunted minds.

Haunted by his father's legacy and the revelation that his mother is alive, Gordon must decipher the Palimpsest's coordinates—requiring reunion with his long-lost twin, Blythe. Together, they represent the paradox Severin foresaw: two halves of a single equation.

As The Machine tightens its grip—deploying spider-dog drones, erasing lives, and weaponizing science—Gordon faces an impossible choice: destroy the knowledge his father died to protect, or embrace it and risk becoming the very tyrant he fears.
